Dual Credit Course Information

Overview

In Dual Credit courses, students earn both high school and post-secondary credits in a particular interest area. These courses are delivered on-line and some have a practicum component. They familiarize students with on-line learning and allow them to complete courses towards possible post-secondary goals. They also serve to build confidence by introducing students to post-secondary learning while still attending high school. Please see the following Dual Credit courses currently available through STAR Catholic Outreach:

Lakeland College (Vermillion/Lloydminster) Courses

NAIT (Edmonton): Waste Water Management

Newman Theological College (Edmonton): Youth Evangelization I-25 and Youth Evangelization II-35

This is a dual-credit program in collaboration with Newman Theological College. The program consists of six on-line courses taught by Newman Theological College instructors. Each course requires the completion of readings, assignments, and participation in on-line discussions. Upon successful completion students receive a Certificate in Youth Evangelization. This is designed for students interested in working in parish youth ministry and who wish to develop skills for effectively engaging people in parish settings. The pathway offers participants courses in the area of Catholicism, Scripture, Jesus and the Sacraments, as well as courses specifically designed around the theory and practice of Youth Ministry. Students will earn both college and up to six high school credits.

Courses do not need to be completed in a specific order. There are six cycles from September to June, of approximately one month in duration, where students can take a course.

Bow Valley College (Calgary) Dual Credit Course Articulation 2018 - Winter (Tentative)

Programming Notes from Bow Valley:

- Anatomy and Physiology Pt. A (10 SH Credits), is a much more intensive course than Med Term I and II. We have found students from a range of academic backgrounds can be successful with MTerm, however A&P is pretty much Bio 30.
- If you had an enrollment of at least 10 for Anatomy and Physiology Pt. A, then I believe we could run it as well for winter. Otherwise, we are open to offering it in the Fall to run over the full school year.
