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# InterEd - STAR Outreach Schools Academic Upgrading Program 2023-2024

STAR Outreach School operates as an accredited high school and offers courses that follow the Alberta Education curriculum. The courses are offered to assist students in preparing to enter programs at any post-secondary institution in Alberta and across Canada. It is the student's responsibility to ensure they are completing any required programming to gain entrance into their desired field of study.

In order to qualify as an InterEd student you must:

- → Be referred to STAR Outreach by your STAR Catholic High School counselor
- → Be registered in a minimum of 10 credits at your STAR Catholic High School within the Academic Year. This is equivalent to a minimum of one 5-credit course per semester. Unless approved by Outreach Administration.

# How do I register?

# What is MyPass and why do I need it?

MyPass is the Alberta government's online application for students to:

- order high school transcripts in English or French
- view diploma exam marks (students receive notification electronically)
- register to write or rewrite diploma exams with online payment
- view and print Detailed Academic Reports (DAR)
- view progress towards a credential (diploma or certificate)
- order additional copies of an awarded credential in English or French

- an Education Account (current students can contact their school and former students can contact Alberta Education Student Records)
- the student's Alberta Student Number (ASN)
- the student's date of birth
- a current personal email address (not your STAR Catholic account)

#### When are the courses offered?

Courses are offered in accordance with <u>STAR Catholic's Leduc/Beaumont Year Calendar</u> which runs from the beginning of September to mid-June. *No courses are offered in July or August.*All courses must be completed in the Academic School year the student is registered in.

Students who do not complete the Midterm Exam by the deadline above will be referred to their respective School Counselor for course withdrawal or extension. Please know, STAR Outreach does not offer Summer School in July or August.

Can I transfer to an Outreach Course if I have already started the course through in-person Learning at a STAR High School?

- Permission for students wanting to transition from in-person learning to Outreach part-way through a semester may be granted with the following understanding;
  - Judgment is made on an individual basis, not for an entire class of students.
  - Consultation with the student and, where applicable, the parent or guardian has taken place.
  - It is in the student's best interest.
  - While every effort will be made to transfer coursework already completed through in-person learning, students may be required to start the course anew.

#### Which courses are offered?

- As an accredited high school, we offer a full complement of core courses required to receive an Alberta high school diploma.
- Students registering for a 30-level diploma course are required to take a government standardized test in addition to completing school-based coursework to receive credit for completion. These exam dates are not changeable. They are mandated by the province of Alberta.
- Diploma exams at STAR Outreach School are administered each year in January, April, and June. InterEd students can write Diploma Exams at their STAR High School in January and June. However, Diplomas in April must be written at STAR Outreach in Leduc.
- The entire Alberta <u>diploma exam schedule</u> can be downloaded from the Alberta Education website.

### What does it cost to take a course?

• No fee is required.

## How long does it take to complete a standard 5-credit core course?

Generally speaking, most students take approximately 16 weeks to complete a 5-credit, 30-level course. Students should be prepared to spend an average of 6 to 7 hours per week on their coursework.

## Can I take more than one course at the same time?

Yes. When you meet with your STAR High School Counsellor, you will create a program plan together to determine your course load.

#### Do I have access to an instructor?

- This is a self-directed program that requires students to work independently at home, at their own pace, via supplied materials provided through our Canvas Platform.
- The instructor will work with each individual student to establish and maintain a schedule for regular assignment submission that fits their lifestyle.
- The Outreach is available for drop-in access to students. All students are required to sign in and out of the building. Students are encouraged to book pre-scheduled appointments when possible. Appointments can occur Online, In-Person or over the phone.
- Appointment space is limited and we cannot guarantee one-to-one guidance for drop-ins. Appointments may be grouped with other students completing courses in that subject area.

## How do I submit completed work and take exams?

- Work submission is done directly through the Canvas Platform, where all students will access their course materials. This process will be outlined during the intake meeting with the instructor.
- To ensure student success, students must have reliable access to the internet, a device to access their course, and a means to print materials. It is beneficial for students to have access to a scanner, but instructions are provided for using a phone to scan and create PDFs for submission.
- There are required on-site evaluations of progress. All exam times must be
  pre-booked with the instructor during our regular school hours of operation.
  Arrangements will be made for InterEd Students to complete required assessments at the STAR High School where they attend regular classes.
- Students must write a midterm, final exam, and diploma exam (if applicable) in the course(s) in which they are registered.

### Do I need prerequisite courses?

InterEd students will need to meet with their STAR High School counselor to create a program plan and determine prerequisite requirements.

#### Code of Conduct - See Website for more information

At STAR Outreach, the student code of conduct is to maintain a positive, productive, and safe learning environment for all members of our school community. More specifically, the term "conduct" refers to student behaviour, attitudes, and effort while at school or while involved in school-related activities.
